School Refusal Workshop

Family Support Roscrea were delighted to be able to host a funded TUSLA Parent
Participation 5-week workshop surrounding
School Refusal which was facilitated by
Aisling O'Connor (Child Psychologist) & Dee
Finucane (Motivational Speaker).

Five young people along with their parents, who are experiencing this issue, were invited to it and we received great feedback on the safe space which was given to this issue! We would like to thank Colaiste Phobal for their collaboration with this workshop and we hope to run it again in the future.









Family Support

Zones of Regulation

During October and November Family Support ran a Zones of Regulation Workshop as an afterschool programme in Scoil Eoin Naofa.

This followed on from a successful Zones of Regulation programme which ran in RYS over the summer.

21 students from Scoil Eoin

participated in the programme within three age groups. We are hoping to roll this out again in the New Year.

The Zones of Regulation is a curriculum based around the use of four colours to help children self-identify how they are feeling and categorise it based on colour.

The curriculum also helps children

better understand their emotions, sensory needs and thinking patterns.
Additionally, the Zones of Regulation helps children to recognise their own triggers, learn to read facial expressions, develop problem-solving skills, and become more attuned to

how their actions affect other people.

IRISH YOUTH JUSTICE SERVICE NATIONAL CONFERENCE

This quarter there was the Irish
Youth Justice Service National
Conference which was held in Croke
Park on the 9th of November with
Minister of State at the Department
of Justice James Browne in
attendance, where he launched a
discussion paper on diverting 18-24year-olds from the criminal justice
system.



Such a system would provide an alternative to prosecution for minor offences, where it could be determined that a person's entry into the wider criminal justice system and particularly prison could result in worse outcomes for the individual and society in the longer term.

The annual conference brings together a staff of Youth Diversion Projects across the country and members of An Garda Síochána to discuss current issues and best practices in the field of youth justice.

This quarter saw the departure of Allison Ryan who left the RYS to go travelling in Australia.




On the 18th August the Roscrea

FAREWELL TO MARIA










