Thank you Amie, we are glad you enjoyed your time here!





RAY Project

The first quarter of the year is a busy time for the RAY Project with the European Social Fund's Non-financial workbook, the Annual Report, the Annual Performance Report, and the First Quarter Report all due for submission to the Department of Justice. The YDP annual budget confirmed (04/04/23) the Project is now able to start planning activities and interventions for the remainder of the year. There are already two exciting collaboration pieces planned with UBU and Tidy Towns involving gardening work and a mosaic to be carried out over the spring and summer months.

The end of February saw the addition of Sophie McCarter (Pictured) as the new Youth Justice Worker in the Youth Diversion Project, and by mid-March the Project Coordinator's roll was filled restoring the YDP team to its full quota.
