## **About Cabragh Wetlands**

Cabragh Wetlands Trust was set up in 1993 when a number of Thurles and Holycross people saw the opportunity presented by the closure of the Thurles Sugar Factory to establish an area of protected wetlands where wildfowl, otters, and endangered plants and other animals could find a safe home. They purchased some land from sugar factory owners and established the first protected wetlands area. The area has now grown to about seventy acres and now boasts a 3,000 square foot visitor and education centre where classes, social events, meetings, small conferences and musical evenings are regularly held.

#### Cabragh and COVID 19

The COVID pandemic and the restrictions to which it gave rise had a number of different effects on our work. Of course many of our activities were severely curtailed. Our school classes for both primary and secondary school students had to cease, as did the use of our facilities for meeting and events. We were particularly disappointed to have to abandon our Irish nights which have been appreciated and enjoyed by a loyal band of followers over the years.

Despite this loss of activity, however, we noticed that many more people have been using the wetlands as a recreation resource during the lockdown period. We are delighted with this and very happy to welcome people to our walks. We hope that as people walk through the wetlands or on our Cosmic Walk that they get to think about nature, its importance and its fragility and how we all need to make an effort to make sure that it is protected.

As well as that the facilities of the wetlands have been upgraded when it was possible during lockdown and, in particular, a major refurbishment of our birdhide is being carried out with the assistance of our very talented CES workers, Tipperary County Council and the Heritage Council.

### **Future Plans**

While everyone can see the lovely nature walks and the fine indoor facilities at Cabragh Wetlands, a lot of work goes on behind the scenes to make sure that the future of the wetlands and the organisation that runs it is secure.

During the lockdown the Committee of Cabragh Wetlands Trust have become Zoom bunnies!! They have been putting in a lot of remote effort to meet the requirements of new regulations and to put in place a future structure that will help it achieve a sustainable future.

Cabragh Wetlands Trust is a charity under the Charities Acts and, as of this year, must be able to demonstrate compliance with the Charities Governance Code. This has required the committee to consider how it operates and develop new written policies and procedures to reflect the excellent manner it which it carries out its work. These days you can't just do it, you must write it down as well. This work has now been complete and the Trust can say with confidence that it is compliant

Very little will change for our friends and customers. It is the old Cabragh Wetlands Trust that will continue with the same purposes and values. It just will be sailing under a slightly different flag.

In addition, the Committee has felt for some time that it would better for the Trust to be established as a company limited by guarantee rather than as an unincorporated body. It has, therefore, set up two new companies So watch this space.

We have also set up a number of new sub-committees which include very skilled and knowledgeable people from outside the Trust as well as committee members. We no have Social Media, Education, Habitat Management Sub-Committees as well as a Technical Advisory Group. We hope this will stand us in good stead in the future and offer our sincere thanks to all involved.
