Tipperary Secondary Schools Track and Field Championships

The Tipperary Secondary Schools Track and Field Championships were held in Templemore on Wednesday 6th April 2022. Coláiste Phobal Ros Cré was successfully represented by 24 students from all year groups in a wide range of events.

Lily-Anne O Meara was first to take to the track and set a high standard for the day when she raced home in 1st place in the minor girls 75m hurdles. She followed this up with a gold medal in the long jump. Lily-Anne also brought home a bronze medal in the 100m sprint and the 4 x 100m relay. In the relay, Mya Steele got the team off to a great start before passing the baton to Lily-Anne. Lily-Anne and Tierna Conlon secured the lead in the 2nd and 3rd legs, and Kayla Dooley finished strongly to bring the girls home in 1st place. However, the relay was run over two heats, with the fastest times determining the overall positions. So despite winning their heat, the girls finished in 3rd place.

Next up was Michael Fitzgerald in the senior boys long jump. After 3 strong jumps, Michael finished in 2nd place with a jump of 5.03m. Meanwhile Marie Shanahan was busy throwing shot putt in the Intermediate girls competition. Her throw of 7.55m earned her a silver medal. Back on the track, Alannah Dunford finished strongly to cross the line in 3rd place in the Inter girls 100m. Her brother Aaron, followed this with a gold medal in the Inter boys 100m. Soon afterwards, Aaron ran a fantastic 400m race and in a very competitive home stretch, Aaron brought home the silver medal. Next up was Ramai Havatitye. A 1st year student, Ramai ran a very intelligent and strategic 800m and despite a very strong kick in the last 100m, Ramai finished in 2nd place.

Last to take take to the track was the senior boys 4 x 100m relay. Once again we were enthralled by a very competitive race. Jake McLoughlin-Thompson got swiftly out of the starting blocks and handed the baton to Kyle Dooley who gained further ground in a strong 2nd leg. He handed on the baton to his brother Graham, who rounded the bend in an accomplished manner. Michael Fitzgerlad battled bravely down the homestretch and brought the boys home in 2nd place.

Many other athletes competed to a very high standard also. Damian Tomkow and Janus van der Merve threw consistently in the junior and senior shot putt respectively. During the Pandemic our members along with other groups and agencies responded where and when we were needed, with Prescription deliveries, food deliveries, medical appointment transport and of course search and rescue operations, alongside these activities many of took part in welfare checks and supports for the elderly and the vulnerable. The Tùs scheme has been operating in Roscrea since 2012 and from its infancy has expanded all over Roscrea town and surrounds. On celebrating its tenth anniversary in Roscrea, the Tùs scheme has grown from 8 participants in early 2012 to a current number of 42 participants as of the end of January 2022.

The Tús initiative is managed by Local Development Companies for the Department of Social Protection and Employment Affairs, which has the overall responsibility for the scheme. North Tipperary Development Company manages the Tús initiative for the North Tipperary region. The two supervisors in Roscrea who co-ordinate the scheme are John Bonfield and Louise Nash. These supervisors have seen the scheme grow and expand in Roscrea and the surrounding regions and are always available to assist and help the local unemployed and communities in the Roscrea region. They have overseen Tùs go through the latest Covid 19 pandemic and helped and supported their participants and communities throughout this time of uncertainty. As the communities emerge and recover from Covid 19, Tùs are glad to be getting back to normal and assisting the participants and communities to return to normality.

People who are eligible for the Tús program, are identified

and contacted by the Department of Employment Activation and Social Protection. If they agree to participate their names will be referred to their local development company. Since 2015, the Department has introduced a self-referral process, where a person if interested can contact their case officer in the local INTREO office or Tùs Supervisor in North Tipperary Development Company and complete the self-referral form to put their names forward. For eligibility details for anyone interested in joining Tùs call in to the Roscrea NTDC office and look to see one of the Tùs Supervisors. Alternatively call or e-mail the supervisors and they will be able to assist. The work carried out by the Tùs participants is community based in the Roscrea region. Some of the areas the participants work in are: -

- Environmental services
- Sporting and Recreational
- Caring Services

- General Community Services and support
- Heritage and cultural services
- Para education Services
- Retail Services

Organisations or Host Communities must be community, voluntary and non-for profit in nature. They must provide good quality work opportunities that are of benefit to the community and the participant. Organisations with a proposed work placement must complete an application and return to North Tipperary Development Company for approval. Please contact Tus Supervisors through phone, email or the Roscrea NTDC office for more details and registration. ETB Community Education

The Community Education section in Tipperary ETB are currently developing a Ukrainian Summer Programme that we hope to roll out in May, June & July, countywide. The programme will be 8 weeks in duration and approx. 2 hours per week, and will include topics such as a local Orientation, Mindfulness & Relaxation, Yoga & Pilates and Cookery courses. Tipperary ETB will be aiming the programme at centres/locations that are currently hosting refugees. Plans are also in place to integrate an element of English language support into the programme.

Our Community Education section continue to support the Roscrea Age Friendly Community Group through the provision of community education courses such as Mindfulness Chair Yoga, Acorn Tablet Training, and Art. In addition to this, the Roscrea Woodies and Peckers community groups are wrapping up their 10-week Wood Carving classes in early May. Both groups avail of weekly 3-hour classes in Abbey Hall.

Tipperary ETB are delighted to support Roscrea Autism Awareness Community Group in 2022, through the provision of 'Autism & Wellbeing' classes throughout February, March and April.

We continue to work closely with disability groups, Irish Wheelchair Association and Avista (St. Annes), in Roscrea through the provision of tutor hours for courses such as Arts & Crafts, Mindfulness and Yoga.
