Hi, I'm Erika! I'm the Co-ordinator here at Roscrea Youth Service, and I also work as part of the UBU Project, supporting young adults aged 18–24. I love being part of RYS — every day is different, and I get to work alongside an incredible staff team and amazing young people who bring so much energy and creativity into the space.

My favourite part of the job is seeing young people grow in confidence, discover their strengths, and realise what they're capable of achieving. Whether it's through programmes, projects, or just a chat over a cup of tea, I'm here to support, listen, and help make RYS a place where everyone feels welcome and valued.

Hi, I'm Tara, a UBU project youth worker at Roscrea Youth Service. I'm here to support young people to build confidence, explore their creativity, and develop skills in a safe and welcoming environment. This is your space, so I want to hear what you want to do and help make it happen.

Our weekly groups are full of fun activities, including pool, soccer, table tennis, board games, and arts & crafts. We also offer one-to-one support if needed, we run workshops and organise fun trips. There are lots of opportunities to try new things. Hi, I'm Katie! I'm a Ukrainian youth worker here in Roscrea. I support Ukrainian young people as they settle into the Irish community, helping them feel at home and connected. I also run a fun and welcoming art club that's open to everyone. We get creative with different art projects and also make time to relax, chat, and look after our wellbeing together.







Hello everyone, my name is Mary Maher and I am a family support worker in Roscrea Youth Service. I love to work as part of a great team with everyone having the same common goals.

My role isn't just about giving advice or pointing people to resources—
it's about listening, being present, and creating a space where people
feel safe and supported. Alongside practical support and education, I've
seen how focusing on wellbeing and self-care helps families grow
stronger together. Often, it's the little moments that mean the most:
seeing a young person start to believe in themselves, or a family finding
new ways to connect and communicate. These moments remind me
that with the right support, families already have the strength they
need to thrive."

Hi, my name is Kailyn

I recently joined Roscrea Youth Service as a Family Support Worker. I'm really passionate about working with young people and their families, and I enjoy being able to offer support, encouragement, and a friendly ear when it's needed. I'm excited to be part of the team here in Roscrea and to play a role in helping young people feel supported and confident in reaching their goals.





I'm Bela, a New Arrival Family Support Worker, I work closely with families living in the Convent and Racket Hall in Roscrea. My role involves providing one-on-one assistance and guidance on accessing essential services such as healthcare and education.

I advise new families on matters related to accessing medical care, enrolling children in schools, and other important aspects of life in Ireland. I also organise integration trips and run group sessions for children to support their social and cultural adjustment.

Additionally, I assist families who do not speak English by providing translation support, ensuring they feel supported and understood during this transition period.





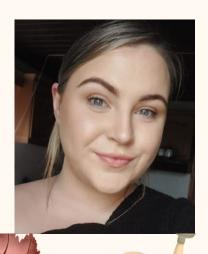


I'm Sophie. As youth justice worker, working with 12–17 year olds! Never a dull moment – and that's exactly why I love it. Every day brings something new: fresh challenges, bold opinions, and the kind of energy that could power a small country. Their spark keeps me fired up to make sure their voices aren't just heard – they're amplified. I'm all about out-of-the-box thinking (bonus points if LEGO bricks are involved), whether it's in workshops, one-to-ones, or casual drop-ins. As part of a Youth Diversion Project, I support young people in making positive choices and creating their own paths forward. I also create safe, supportive spaces for LGBTQ+teens – because everyone deserves to show up as their full, fabulous self. No matter what's going on for them, I have got their back – cheering them on, showing up, and holding space when they need it most. Best bit? Watching young people grow into who they really are.

Hi, I'm Caitlin!

Some of you might know me from when I worked as a Family Support Worker, but since June I've been with the Youth Diversion Project. I work with 12–17-year-olds, and you'll usually catch me running groups, drop-ins, one-to-ones, iScoil and other events for my teenagers. The best part of my job is the amazing young people I get to work with — helping them see new possibilities, find their voice, and know they've got someone in their corner when things get tough. I'm here to remind them that there are loads of opportunities out there (even if it doesn't always feel that way) and to have their back whenever they need it.





My name is Mary, and I've been delighted to be part of the youth service team for the past 4 years. I work as an Early Intervention Worker with the YDP, supporting children aged 8–11 years. What I love most about my role is getting to know each young person through the fun activities and projects we do together. On the 7th of July, our group, along with some Ukrainian young people from the convent, travelled to Cloughjordan for an exciting circus skills workshop. Everyone had the chance to try out a variety of fun activities, including hula hoops, feathers, wire walking, the balance beam, parachute games, and skipping ropes. The young people threw themselves into the challenges with great energy and enthusiasm, learning new skills while sharing plenty of laughter. To top it all off, we were blessed with beautiful sunny weather, making it a fantastic day of fun, creativity, and connection.

Following on from this success, we came together again on the 29th of July in Muintir na Tíre Hall, Roscrea, for an even bigger workshop with a larger group. This time, the activities included hula hoops, hats, unicycles, and juggling. Once again, the hall was filled with energy, laughter, and teamwork as everyone got the chance to try something new and show off their growing circus skills.















Drumming

On the 15th of July, we held a lively drumming workshop that proved to be very popular. The young people had the chance to try out new beats, learn about different types of drums and how they are made, and, most importantly, enjoy making music together. This was also a fantastic integration workshop, giving participants the opportunity to connect, make new friends, and share in the fun of rhythm and sound in a supportive environment. Meditation and Sound Bowls

Recently, our Youth Service hosted two very special wellbeing sessions – one for young people and another for parents. Both gatherings offered the chance to slow down, relax, and experience the soothing effects of guided meditation alongside the calming sounds of crystal sound bowls. The atmosphere was truly serene, with everyone leaving the sessions feeling grounded, peaceful, and refreshed. For many, it was a rare opportunity to step away from busy routines and find a moment of quiet calm. We were delighted by the positive feedback from both groups, with participants describing the sessions as "restorative," "zen," and "exactly what was needed." We hope to offer more meditation and sound bowl sessions in the future.

Two stop motion workshops took place during the summer, with one group of ages 8-11 years and another for ages 12–17 years. These sessions were all about creativity, imagination, and teamwork, as the young people worked together to plan, design, and create their very own animations. Upcycling - Creative Keyrings

In a collaborative session between New Arrivals and Early Intervention took place on the 10th of July, young people had the opportunity to design, colour, and sew their very own keyrings. The room was full of focus and concentration as everyone worked on their creations, and the sense of achievement when each piece was completed was wonderful to see. Many participants commented on how relaxing they found the sewing process, making it not only a creative activity but also a calming and rewarding experience. This workshop was a fantastic way for young people to express themselves, develop new skills, and take home a personalised keepsake they could be proud of.







Crime Prevention Programme

Over the past number of weeks, our team has had the pleasure of visiting several of our local primary schools to deliver the Crime Prevention Programme. The programme took place in Moneygall, Dunkerrin, and Scoil Eoin Naofa and ran over the course of four weeks.

Each week, the children took part in discussions and activities designed to raise awareness about making positive choices, understanding consequences, and learning how to stay safe in different situations. The final week was a real highlight, with pupils getting creative in a poster competition and also welcoming a special visit from members of An Garda Síochána. This gave the children a valuable opportunity to meet their local Gardaí, ask questions, and gain a better understanding of the important role they play in our community.

We were delighted with the level of engagement shown by the pupils throughout the programme — their curiosity, enthusiasm, and willingness to learn made each session both lively and meaningful. It has been wonderful to see such strong collaboration between the schools, the Gardaí, and our youth service in supporting young people's learning and development. A huge thank you goes out to the staff in the schools, the Gardaí, and of course the pupils themselves for their participation and support in making this programme such a success.







Connect Safely

Recently, we had the opportunity to facilitate the Connect Safely Programme with 3rd Class in Scoil Eoin Naofa, delivered in partnership with Barnardos. This five-week programme focused on helping children learn how to stay safe online in a fun and engaging way. Using games, interactive activities, and discussions, the sessions explored important topics such as privacy, cyberbullying, consent, and making good digital choices.

There was fantastic engagement from the pupils, with plenty of thoughtful questions and contributions throughout the weeks. It was great to see the children taking such an active interest in their own online safetu.

A big thank you goes out to everyone who took part and supported the programme. We are delighted to share that we will be bringing Connect Safely to Sacred Heart Primary School after the Halloween break, and we look forward to continuing this important work with more young people.
